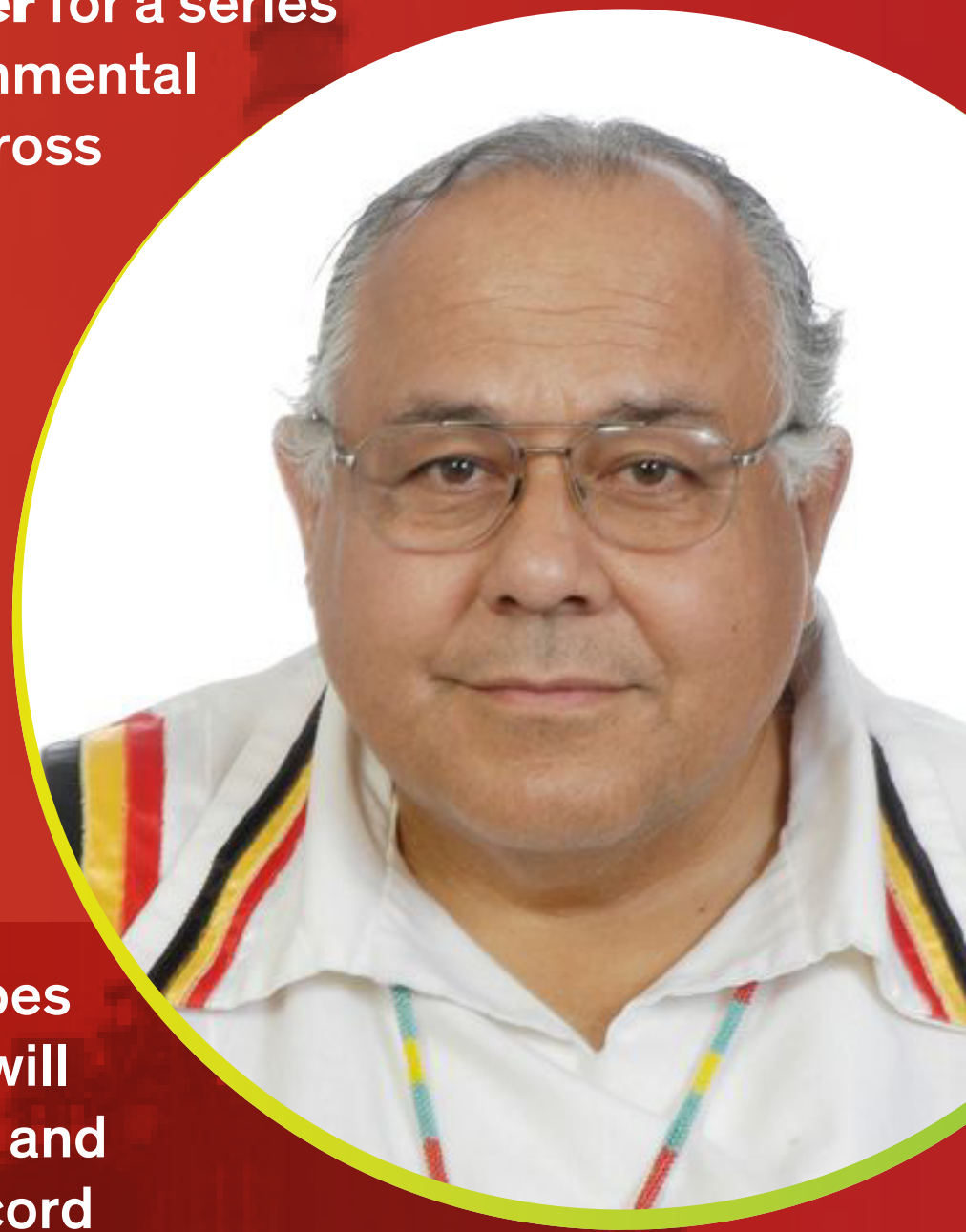


Climates of Fall 2022 Inequality
